Richard Daley College Scholarships

Each spring, the Richard J. Daley College Scholarship committee, composed of two students, two faculty members, and two administrators, invites second year students to apply for Daley College Scholarships. Scholarships are awarded to students planning to continue their education after leaving Daley College. Selection of scholarship winners is based on achievement of general academic excellence. Information and applications are available in the Dean of Student Services Office.

Dr. Mark D. Warden Scholarship

This scholarship, offered by the President of Daley College, recognizes students who excel academically and are involved in either college and/or community activities. Information on the scholarship is available in the Dean of Student Services Office.

Illinois MIA/POW Scholarship

This scholarship is a tuition scholarship for student dependents of Illinois prisoners of war and servicemen missing in action. Contact the Financial Aid Office.

Illinois National Guard/Naval Militia Scholarship

Members of the Illinois National Guard or Naval Militia, having served for at least one year, are eligible for a scholarship which pays tuition and appropriate fees. Contact the Financial Aid Office.

Harold Washington Academic Scholarship

Upon the recommendation of the College Presidents, the Board of Trustees of the City Colleges of Chicago awards up to 100 Harold Washington Academic Scholarships per college to students with academic potential. This scholarship is for students who demonstrate promise as evidenced by exceptional high school academic performance or outstanding achievement on the test of General Educational Development (GED). You must also have recommendations from an employer, pastor, teacher, advisor, or other community leaders with knowledge of the student's academic potential. Students may apply for the scholarship at the Dean of Student Services Office. The scholarship renewal is based on class performance and local option, and cover the full cost of tuition. The criteria for the scholarship are:

- Current 3.00 GPA or better
- Chicago residency
- Full-time enrollment in a degree or advanced certificate program
- Expectation of maintaining a 3.0 GPA or higher
- Any other attributes recognized, in the College President's judgment, warranting consideration.

Kennedy-King College Scholarships

The Florence Ballenger Scholarship

The Florence Ballenger Scholarship provides financial support to students who have demonstrated academic excellence and commitment to civic services. This scholarship is awarded to incoming, returning, and transfer students. Students who have completed a baccalaureate degree program are not eligible for this award. Incoming and transfer students must satisfy all admissions requirements (submit an Admission Data Form, have official transcripts on file, take the placement test, if applicable) before the scholarship will be awarded.

The Nursing Educational Scholarship Program

The Nursing Educational Scholarship Program provides assistance to qualified individuals pursuing a certificate in practical nursing, an associate degree in nursing, a hospital based nursing diploma or a baccalaureate degree in nursing. Applications are available in the Nursing Department, Room 3E45. Applications must be completed by May 31 st.

Harold Washington Academic Achievement Scholarship

This scholarship is for prospective or current students who demonstrate promise as evidenced by high school academic performance or exceptional GED scores. Recommendations from an employer, pastor, teacher, counselor, or other community leaders with knowledge of the student's academic potential may be used in lieu of grades.

These scholarships are renewable based on class performance and local option, and cover the full cost of tuition. Applications must be on file by July 1.

Scholarships

Community Leadership and Development Scholarship

This \$5,000 renewable scholarship available only to new incoming Master of Arts students for Fall 2006. Scholarship recipients will be selected based on a proposal that communicates their ideas and plan for making a leadership contribution to The Chicago School and the larger Chicago community. In addition, applicants should communicate leadership goals, past work with community service, and experience with diversity issues. A recommendation from a supervisor of a prior community service or leadership project is also required.



Underrepresented Student Scholarship

This \$5,000 renewable scholarship is open to new students in all programs. Understanding diversity and the importance of working with underserved populations are core components of The Chicago School's mission and philosophy. Applicants for this scholarship should submit a 250-word essay on the following topic, "How my diverse background will contribute to The Chicago School and the field of psychology."

Honors Scholarship

One \$5,000 non-renewable scholarship will be awarded per program to incoming students with prior exemplary academic performance.

Need Based Scholarship

These renewable scholarships, up to \$5,000, are awarded based on academic performance, financial needs, and previous awards. New and continuing students in all programs are eligible for consideration. The Award Application can be submitted at any time throughout the academic year, however, awards will be made on a first come first serve basis. To apply students must submit a copy of their most recent tax return and a personal expense budget for one year, itemized by monthly expenses.

Transitions Scholarship

Available to new and continuing students in all programs, the Transitions Scholarship is a non-renewable \$5,000 award for students who will be returning to school, full time, after having been in the work force several years. Applicants should provide a written proposal on how they plan to handle the transition of attending graduate school full time based on prior work/life experience. Applicants also should submit their most recent tax return and a personal expense budget for one year, itemized by monthly expenses.

First Generation Scholarship

This renewable scholarship is for new students of all programs. Applicants must be a first-generation college graduate.

All scholarships require that the student exhibit financial need through the completion of a 2006-2007 FAFSA with the exception of the Honors Scholarship. Scholarship application deadline is April 1 for new students (or upon application) and May 1 for continuing students. For more information on these awards contact finaid@csopp.edu.

Merit Scholarships

Entering M.A. and M.Div. students may apply for a merit-based scholarship of up to full tuition. These competitive scholarships are awarded to students who show an exemplary educational record and promise for theological education and ministry. Applicants must have earned a G.P.A. of at least 3.25



on a 4.0 scale in their undergraduate studies (or most recent, completed degree). Awards may be granted to part-time or full-time students. Merit-based scholarships are renewable for the length of the academic program, as long as the student maintains a G.P.A. of at least 3.5.

TO APPLY, complete the “Application for CTS Financial Aid” and submit it with all of your admissions application materials by March 1. U.S. citizens and permanent residents are also asked to file the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) by February 15.

Need-based Grants

Any M.A., M.Div. or international student may apply for a need-based grant. These one-year or one-time awards are for tuition only. Students are eligible to re-apply for a need-based grant each year. A student’s financial need is assessed using the FAFSA and the “Application for CTS Financial Aid.”

TO APPLY, complete the “Application for CTS Financial Aid” and submit it by March 1. U.S. citizens and permanent residents are also asked to file the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) by February 15. New students should include the “Application for CTS Financial Aid” with their completed admissions application materials.

Trustee Award

Arthur J. Schmitt Scholarship

Awards range from \$11,000 to \$13,000

Academic scholarships are awarded to freshmen admitted for the fall term based on their academic achievement in high school. The Arthur J. Schmitt scholarship is the most prestigious scholarship awarded to students entering the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, the School of Education or the School of Computer Science, Telecommunications and Information Systems. It is awarded to students who demonstrate an exceptional level of achievement, placing them in the highest tier of our applicant pool.

Schmitt scholarships are renewable for up to four years of continuous, full-time undergraduate enrollment at DePaul University. Students must earn 36 quarter hours annually and maintain a 3.30 grade point average.

Fritz A. Bauer Scholarship

Awards range from \$11,000 to \$13,000

Academic scholarships are awarded to freshmen admitted for the fall term based on their academic achievement in high school. The Fritz A. Bauer scholarship is the most prestigious scholarship awarded to students entering the College of Commerce. It is awarded to students who demonstrate an exceptional level of achievement, placing them in the highest tier of our applicant pool.

Bauer scholarships are renewable for up to four years of continuous, full-time undergraduate enrollment at DePaul University. Students must earn 36 quarter hours annually and maintain a 3.30 grade point average.

Presidential Scholarship

Awards range from \$9,500 to \$10,500

Academic scholarships are awarded to freshmen admitted for the fall term based on their academic achievement in high school. The selection committee considers a variety of factors including test scores, high school curriculum and community/extracurricular activities. The Presidential Scholarship is awarded to students who demonstrate outstanding achievement as compared to other students in our applicant pool. Presidential scholarships are renewable for up to four years of continuous, full-time undergraduate enrollment at DePaul University. Students must earn 36 quarter hours annually and maintain a 3.00 grade point average.



Centennial Scholarship

Awards range from \$4,000 to \$9,000

Academic scholarships are awarded to freshmen admitted for the fall term based on their academic achievement in high school. The selection committee considers a variety of factors including test scores, high school curriculum and community/extracurricular activities. The Centennial Scholarship is awarded to students who have performed well above average, as compared to other students in our applicant pool.

Centennial scholarships are renewable for up to four years of continuous, full-time undergraduate enrollment at DePaul University. Students must earn 36 quarter hours annually and maintain a 2.70 grade point average.

DePaul Community Service Scholarship

\$6,500 a year for up to four years of consecutive, full-time undergraduate enrollment at DePaul University

The mission of the Community Service Scholarship is to seek and reward students who have demonstrated an exceptional record of community service. It is the goal of this program to provide mentoring to the recipients of the scholarship as well as to involve them in service with DePaul and Chicago communities. Students who have benefited from community service programs are strongly encouraged to apply.

Recipients will be required to minor in Community Service Studies at DePaul University. The Community Service Studies minor comprises six additional courses, three of which are unique to the Community Service Studies program. Community Service Scholars are also required to complete at least 30 hours of community service each quarter with one of the many community partners of the Steans Center for Community-based Service Learning at DePaul. Additionally, recipients must meet with the Program Coordinator for Community Service Studies quarterly on an individual basis as well as on a large group basis. DePaul Leadership Scholarship

\$6,500 a year for up to four years of consecutive, full-time undergraduate enrollment at DePaul University

The mission of the Leadership Scholarship is to reward students who have demonstrated an exceptional record of leadership within their high school, home or religious community. It is the goal of this program to provide mentoring to the recipients of the scholarship as well as to involve them in service with DePaul and Chicago communities. Recipients are required to maintain contact with the Student Leadership Institute and/or University Ministries for mentoring and advising purposes.

Monsignor Egan Hope Scholarship

\$10,000 a year for up to four years of consecutive, full-time undergraduate enrollment at DePaul University

The Egan Hope Scholarship Program was initiated in 1992 to honor Monsignor John Egan, on the 50th anniversary of his ordination to the priesthood. The program was developed in response to a need for programs that would enable inner city students from Chicago neighborhoods to earn college degrees.

The mission of the Egan Hope Scholars Program is to seek and reward City of Chicago students who have demonstrated a significant commitment to community service within their high school and/or neighborhood. Students who have initiated and/or participated in community programs are sought because of the time commitment and extraordinary effort it takes to serve others. In addition, candidates must demonstrate financial need as determined by the University through the *Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

*File the FAFSA as soon as possible after January 1st, but no later than March 1st.

Art



Awards range from \$2,000 to \$5,000

Admission to DePaul University in a declared Art major must be awarded by February 1, 2006 for consideration of the portfolio application. The scholarship portfolio application must be received by the Scholarship Coordinator by February 1, 2006. The portfolio should contain 8 – 10 pieces of

artwork (either individual slides or on a CD-ROM) with titles, medium and size clearly identified as well as an art resume' of shows attended and awards won. Portfolios must be submitted directly to the Scholarship Coordinator at 1 E. Jackson Blvd. Suite 9100, Chicago, Illinois 60604 by February 1, 2006 for further consideration by a committee of DePaul Art Department faculty.

Art scholarships are renewable for up to four years of continuous, full-time undergraduate enrollment at DePaul University. Students must earn 36 quarter hours annually and remain in good academic standing as an Art Major.

Music Performance

Award amounts vary

Candidates must apply for admission to the School of Music by January 15, 2006 and complete an audition. Please contact the School of Music to set up an audition at 773-325-7444.

Music Performance scholarships are renewable for up to four years of consecutive, full-time undergraduate enrollment in the School of Music. Students must earn at least 36 quarter hours annually and make satisfactory progress toward their degree. In addition, Performance scholarship recipients must audition for and perform as assigned in School of Music performance ensembles, as determined by the ensemble conducting faculty. (Ensembles include Symphony Orchestra, Chamber Orchestra, Wind Ensemble, Wind Symphony, Jazz Ensembles, all choral groups and opera productions. Please note: ensemble participation is separate from the curriculum requirements.)

Theatre Performance

Awards range from \$5,000 to \$8,000

Applicants to the BFA Acting Program receive automatic consideration upon completing the application and audition process. Applications for admission to The Theatre School must be postmarked by January 15, 2006.

Candidates must be a declared Acting major and entering The Theatre School at DePaul University in the fall term. Applicants must have auditioned at one of our admission auditions, generally held November through February. Please contact the Theatre School to set up an audition at 773-325-7999.

Theatre Performance scholarships are renewable for up to four years of continuous, full-time undergraduate enrollment as an Acting major at The Theatre School at DePaul University. Students must maintain full-time enrollment status and earn at least 36 quarter hours annually and maintain good academic standing.

Theatre Design Scholarship

Awards range from \$5,000 to \$8,000

Ida Brechtel Scholarship for Students Majoring in Chemistry or Biology-Chemistry

Students who qualify for the Presidential, Dean's, Honor or Transfer Merit Scholarship, and are planning to major in chemistry or in biology-chemistry, are invited to apply for an Ida Brechtel Scholarship. Scholarships are \$7,500 a year for up to four years. To apply, simply submit a 200-300 word essay explaining your decision to major in chemistry or biology-chemistry, and how it applies to your future career plans. The application deadline is February 3.

Murphy Star Scholarships

Leadership awards for out of state students average \$2,500.

Dominican Scholarships

Dominican Scholarships, valued at \$1,000 per year, are available to graduating seniors from Dominican high schools. Awards are renewable provided the students meet the grade point requirement and continue full-time enrollment.

Dominican Pillar Scholarship

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarships

These scholarships, \$8,000 for students with a GPA of 3.5 or higher or \$6,000 for students whose GPA is 3.3 to 3.49, are available to full-time students entering Dominican University as members of Phi Theta Kappa, the international honor society for two-year colleges. Students receiving Phi Theta Kappa Scholarships are not eligible for Transfer Merit Scholarships.

Transfer Merit Scholarships

\$7,000 Transfer Merit Scholarships are awarded to entering full-time transfer students who have a 3.5 grade point average from their previous institutions at the time of acceptance to Dominican University. Students who have at least a 3.3 grade point average can receive a \$5,000 scholarship. To be eligible for the Transfer Merit Scholarship, a student must have completed at least 24 semester hours. Transfer students with less than 24 credits may receive scholarship consideration based on their high school records.

Alumnae/i Legacy Scholarships

Renewable awards of \$2,000 are available to children of Dominican University graduates. Awards are for full-time undergraduate students pursuing their first bachelor's degree.

Family Allowances

Family allowances of \$1,000 per student are available when two or more members of an immediate family, living at the same address, attend Dominican University full time.

EWU Funded Scholarship Programs

All scholarship awards are subject to availability of funds. Students can avail themselves of only one of the following scholarships except the merit-cum means scholarship, which can be earned along with another institutional scholarship.

High School Merit Scholarship

This scholarship is available to high school graduates with a GPA of 3.0 or better. The scholarship amount of \$1,000 per academic year will be divided into three equal parts in the form of cash or credited to the student's account at the end of the third week of each quarter after verification of attendance. A student must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better and maintain full-time status.

Transfer Scholarship

This scholarship is available to associate degree graduates transferring to EWU with a GPA of 3.0 or better. The scholarship amount of \$1,000 per academic year for two years will be disbursed to students in the form of cash or credit to their account at the end of the third week of classes after verification of attendance. A student must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better and maintain a full-time status.

Continuing Education Scholarship

This scholarship is available to working adults. The scholarship provides 25% tuition reduction per academic year for each working adult sponsored by East-West University until the completion of the student's education at EWU. A student must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better and continue going to school full-time without interruption until graduation.

Institutional Academic Scholarship

This scholarship awards up to 30% reduction in the total tuition for an academic year. Students who receive full federal and state financial aid are not eligible. A student must enroll full-time, complete associate's or bachelor's degree, maintain a 2.0 GPA both quarterly and cumulative, demonstrate financial need, register every year for at least one course in the area of Islamic studies and earn a passing grade.

The scholarship course should be taken in the first quarter of enrollment unless the student is officially advised to take it later in the same academic year.

Merit-Cum Means Scholarship

This scholarship is available to currently enrolled students. The scholarship amount of \$300 or \$500 per year will be disbursed to students if they maintain full-time status and achieve a quarterly and cumulative GPA of 3.0 or 3.5 respectively.

Graduation Incentive Scholarship

Based on financial need, a student may earn \$500 of a Graduation Incentive Scholarship in each academic year provided he/she maintains a full-time student status and a quarterly and cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or better, and completes his/her degree at East-West University. After the

award, the scholarship funds will be credited to the student's account for payment of tuition and fees, etc.

Shared Opportunity Scholarship (SOS)

Based on financial need, a student may be awarded up to \$1,600 per year for payment of tuition and fees provided he/she maintains a quarterly and cumulative grade point average of 2.00 or better and completes at least one year of continuous full-time study at East-West University.

University Scholarships for Undergraduate Students

Scholarship eligibility is highly competitive and is determined by evaluating the academic data provided by the Undergraduate Admissions Office and financial data obtained from the FAFSA. The Office of Financial Aid administers renewals of the awards. Unless otherwise noted, these scholarships are renewable for four years and apply only to undergraduate students who maintain full-time status. Students are not eligible for renewal of their IIT scholarships while participating in a co-op program. All IIT scholarships require satisfactory academic progress and most have additional academic requirements. Students may check their award letter for more specific details regarding scholarships awarded.

Fellowships, Scholarships, and Assistantships for Graduate Students

Fulltime students applying to Professional Master's Programs who have exceptionally strong academic records may be eligible for one of a limited number of one-year, half-tuition academic scholarships. Fulltime students applying to M.S. and Ph.D. programs may qualify for fellowships, scholarships, and assistantships. You will be considered automatically for scholarships, fellowships, and assistantships at the time the admission decision is made—as long as you apply by the funding deadline listed on the admission application.

A fellowship provides financial support to defray the cost of tuition and a stipend for living expenses. A tuition scholarship provides all or part of the tuition only. Both are exempt from federal income taxes. Most degree programs provide financial support for teaching assistants who help with instruction and research assistants who work on funded research projects. Graduate assistants may receive support in the form of a stipend and/or tuition support.

Continuing students should apply to their major academic unit. Acceptance of an award or appointment for the fall semester is considered binding on the student after April 15. If a student's academic work is judged to be unsatisfactory, the award may be canceled at the discretion of the university at any time during the period covered

Academic Scholarships

To be considered for any of Loyola's academic scholarships, students must submit a completed Application for Undergraduate Admission (there is no separate scholarship application). Students should be admitted no later than February 1 for scholarship consideration.

If you need an Application for Undergraduate Admission, contact the Undergraduate Admission Office at 1.800.262.2373, or you may apply online.

Each application is carefully read and scholarships are competitively awarded based on outstanding service and achievement, and standardized test scores (ACT or SAT). Admission applications are reviewed for scholarship consideration on a first-come, first-served basis.

Academic Scholarships: Freshmen

Presidential, Damen, Loyola and Trustee Scholarships

These scholarships are awarded to academically qualified students based on information provided in the admission application process, without regard to financial need.

The Presidential Scholarship is a four-year scholarship, totaling \$50,000 (\$12,500 per year)

The Damen Scholarship is a four-year scholarship, totaling \$36,000 (\$9,000 per year)

The Loyola Scholarship is a four-year scholarship, totaling \$30,000 (\$7,500 per year)

The Trustee Scholarship is a four-year scholarship, totaling \$20,000 (\$5,000 per year)

Academic Scholarships: Transfers

These scholarships are offered to academically qualified undergraduate transfer students. Scholarships are renewable for up to three years based on the student maintaining a 3.0 cumulative grade point average (GPA), completion of at least 12 credit hours each term, and reapplying each year. Transfer scholarships range from \$4,000 to \$6,000 per year.

Note: Scholarships are renewed at the award amount applicable to the student's first year of enrollment.

Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) Scholarships

- Recipients must enroll in at least 12-15 quarter hours each term to receive \$500.
- For any term that enrollment is 6–11 quarter hours, the student will receive \$250. Focus courses are not considered in determining term enrollment hours.

*NLU reserves the right to exclude non-academic coursework from the calculation.

Please be advised that undergraduate scholarships can only be applied toward NLU tuition and are not refundable to the student. Students who receive other NLU scholarships, waivers, grants and discounts that total 25% or more of tuition for any term are not eligible to receive the Transfer Recognition Scholarship for that term.

Northwestern University

Northwestern University does not offer merit based scholarships (based on academics) to any of its students, domestic or international. However, Northwestern does award financial aid to U.S. citizens and permanent residents on the basis of financial need. In addition, Northwestern will offer need-based

financial awards to a small group of international students entering in Fall 2006. Please see the information under Financial Aid for International Students for details on this new policy.

Students in the process of obtaining permanent residency should be aware that they cannot be considered for financial aid until they receive actual documentation of their immigration status in the country. The following is a list of acceptable documentation that establishes aid eligibility:



For Permanent Residents:

1. Permanent Resident Card (formerly Resident Alien Card): Form I-551 (also acceptable is the no longer used Alien Registration Receipt Card: Form I-151)
2. Arrival/Departure Record: Form I-94 (current) with an A-Number annotated on it with one of the following endorsements:
 - (a) "Processed for I-551..." with valid expiration date
 - (b) "Temporary Form I-551..." with appropriate entry information, date, and signatures
3. Home country passport endorsed "Processed for I-551" with valid expiration date

For Other Eligible Non-Citizens:

Other non-citizens may be eligible for federal financial aid. The most commonly presented evidence is a current I-94 with a stamp indicating specific status such as refugees or asylees. If you have specific questions about your status, please contact us.

Financial Aid for International Students

Northwestern University will offer need-based financial aid awards to a small group of international students entering in Fall 2006. Citizens of countries outside the United States who apply under Regular Decision for financial aid will be reviewed as a separate group. The usual selective admission criteria, as well as the amount of financial aid needed by an applicant, will be factors in the admission committee's decision. As a result, Northwestern will not offer admission to some candidates who are otherwise well-qualified. For these reasons, the admission rate for international applicants requesting aid is substantially lower than for those not requesting aid. Only those students who apply for and receive financial aid for their freshman year will be eligible to receive financial assistance in subsequent years. There is no financial aid available for international transfer applicants or international students applying under Early Decision.

U.S. citizens living abroad, permanent residents of the U.S., and other eligible non-U.S. citizens may receive financial aid from Northwestern and should follow the same application process as U.S.

citizens for financial aid. Enrolling permanent residents will be asked to submit the proper documents showing their immigration status to finalize the award.

International students receiving financial aid from Northwestern must still plan to contribute to funding their educational expenses. For example, students will be responsible for travel expenses to the U.S. from their home country. Northwestern University cannot assume responsibility for economic changes such as currency fluctuation, nor can it replace lost support that a student may have expected to receive from relatives, sponsors, or government and corporate grants.

The Office of Undergraduate Financial Aid has the most detailed and current information about financial aid policy and further instructions on how to correctly complete financial aid forms.



International Students Planning To Pursue Advanced Degrees

International students receiving need-based financial aid from Northwestern for their undergraduate degree should be aware that this funding will not continue if they choose to pursue medical school, law school, graduate school, or any other professional studies at Northwestern University.

Northwestern Scholarship assistance

Any undergraduate student enrolled in a degree-seeking program may apply for consideration for Northwestern Scholarship assistance. All NU Scholarships are awarded on the basis of demonstrated financial need and availability of funding at the time the student applies for aid. Approximately one-half of all Northwestern undergraduate students receive NU Scholarship assistance, and recipients come from families with a wide range of income backgrounds. The chart below illustrates the average NU Scholarship amounts based on income level for the 2005-06 entering freshman class. Please note that many, if not most, of the families with higher income levels who receive NU Scholarships have more than one child attending college.

Recognition Scholarship

The Admission office will review your transcripts and test scores to determine eligibility for this award. Awards are made based on fulltime enrollment and reduced to ½ of the award for less than full-time enrollment. This award can only be used during the Fall/Spring terms. Unused awards cannot be used during the summer or carried over to the next academic year. The amount of this award in combination with the MAP, Pell or other forms of institutional aid and outside resources cannot exceed the cost of tuition. The award ranges from \$1500 to \$7500 per academic year. You must maintain a cumulative RU grade point average (GPA) of 3.25 to continue to receive this award.

Presidential Scholarship

This scholarship opportunity is offered to new undergraduate students with an exceptional academic background. New College of Performing Arts (CPA) students are not eligible for this award. Please note that Chicago College of Performing Arts students are not eligible for this award because CCPA includes academic achievement in its Conservatory Awards.

The Admission office will review your transcripts and test scores to determine your eligibility for this award. You must be enrolled in at least twelve credit hours per term and this award can only be used during the Fall/Spring terms. Unused awards cannot be used during the summer or carried over to the next academic year.

The amount of this award in combination with the MAP, Pell or other forms of institutional aid cannot exceed the cost of tuition. The award covers up to \$9000 toward tuition per academic year. You must maintain a cumulative RU grade point average (GPA) 3.50 to continue to receive this award.

Phi Theta Kappa Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded to undergraduate transfer students who have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5 in all transferable courses. New College of Performing Arts (CPA) students are not eligible for this award but should contact the CPA office for details on all scholarship eligibility.

Eligible students must also provide proof of current Phi Theta Kappa membership. The scholarship is a one-time award of \$1500.



STAR Program

This scholarship program is designed to prepare underrepresented students at the Chicago Campus to be teachers.

Applicants must be new freshmen undergraduates with a high school GPA of 3.25 or higher. This award can be used to cover a student's unmet need up to 13 credit hours per term.

Financing: Need-Based

Financial aid based on need is not available to international students. However, international students are eligible to work on campus for up to 20 hours per week during the academic year and 40 hours per week during vacation periods. Students can review job listings in the Career Development Center and apply directly to the office advertising each position. The School sends a financial aid award letter, notifying you of your work eligibility for each semester of the academic year.

Financing: Merit Scholarships

The School awards scholarships to undergraduates based on the merit of their portfolio work. Admissions counselors review portfolios and forward their recommendations to the Merit Review Committee. From this pool of candidates, the Committee selects individuals to receive a limited number of scholarships. There is no separate application for this scholarship.
